26 27 28 29 30 31 32	Permits shall not be granted unless the applicant provides reasonable assurance that all property taxes, sewage disposal service charges and drain or sewer assessments applicable to the mobile home, including those for the current tax year, have been paid or that the mobile home is exempt from such taxes.

This bill facilitates the collection of sewage disposal charges and drain or sewer assessments on mobile homes.

Because mobile homes are purchased as personal property, there is no deed in a registry of deeds to which a notice of lien may be affixed. A mobile home may be sold and transported out of a municipality and into another county. The municipality would then have difficulty recovering outstanding sewage disposal charges or sewer assessments against a new owner because a new owner would have neither actual nor constructive notice of these charges or assessments. This bill prohibits the issuance of a permit for the transport of a mobile home unless the applicant makes reasonable assurances that these charges or assessments have been paid by using the same permit issuance provision that applies to payment of property taxes.

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
