The bill also establishes the intent of the Legislature to provide money from the General Fund for qualifying hatcheries when the Lobster Fund is insufficient.

The lobster fishery is the single most valuable component of the fishing industry and is of key importance to the tourist industry and the economies of many small coastal towns. In contrast to many other industries, the State invests virtually none of its general revenues in the lobster industry. The industry, through license fees in the Lobster Fund, provides virtually all state-level funding directly relevant to lobster conservation efforts.

Lobster hatchery programs are a promising avenue for stabilizing the lobster resource. The State currently assists towns or private groups in the establishment and operation of lobster hatcheries. Funding is supplied by the industry-supported Lobster Fund. The Lobster Fund is too small to adequately support the hatchery program and the other activities mandated by the Legislature.

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
