The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife may now attempt to generate profits from the sale of a wildlife management area's natural products. He does not presently enjoy, the authority to authorize nonprofit activities with the various areas' natural products. The bill corrects this gap in the commissioner's power and permits him to arrange for the removal of natural resources by the host localities where the circumstances warrant.

The particular circumstances which demonstrated the need for this bill involve the towns of Hodgdon and Linneus and Cary Plantation. Within their municipal boundaries lies an extensive ridge of high quality gravel which in turn lies within the boundaries of the Manuel Wildlife Management Area. The 3 municipalities want to be able to remove reasonable amounts of gravel at no or low cost from the wildlife management area within their municipal limits. This bill allows them to do so with the approval of the commissioner.
