	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:									
	Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §603, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 382, §3, is amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:									
	Except as otherwise specifically provided in this subchapter or in Title 22, chapter 258-A, no ordinance or regulation of a municipality, including, but not limited to, an action by a local governmental agency or department, board of county commissioners or a town or city council or a local regulation

Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §1471-A, as amended by PL 1983, c. 542, §§1 and 3, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

Except as otherwise specifically provided in this chapter or in Title 7, chapter 103, subchapter II-A, no ordinance or regulation of a municipality, including, but not limited to, an action by a local governmental agency or department, board of county commissioners or a town or city council or a local regulation adopted by the use of an initiative or referendum measure, may prohibit or in any way attempt to regulate any matter relating to the sale and application of chemical pesticides, fungicides, herbicides and other chemical pesticides, and any of these ordinances, laws or regulations are void and of no force or effect.

## 22 STATEMENT OF FACT

Currently, the Board of Pesticides Control and various municipalities are both enacting rules and regulations in the area of pesticides control. The bill assures uniformity on this field by giving the board's rules a preemptive effect over all other regulations.
