21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
22 follows:

23 36 MRSA §6108, first ¶, as amended by PL 1981, c.
24 698, §189, is further amended to read:

25 No claim otherwise allowable may be granted to
26 claimants of single member households with household
27 income in excess of \$5,600 in calendar year 1980 and
28 \$6,200 in each succeeding year for which relief is
29 requested; and no claim otherwise allowable may be
30 granted to claimants of households of 2 or more mem-
31 bers with income in excess of \$6,700 in calendar year
32 1980 and ~~\$7,400~~ \$8,900 in each succeeding year for
33 which relief is requested.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this bill is to increase the income limitation for claimants with 2 or more persons in the household under the Elderly Householders Tax and Rent Refund Act. The limitation is raised from \$7,400, which represents the eligibility cutoff currently in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, section 6108, plus the income eligibility adjustment factor for 1986 to \$8,900.

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
