18 Provisions to Certain Excluded

21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
22 follows:

23 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §13502, sub-§1, ¶¶B and C, as  
24 enacted by PL 1983, c. 859, Pt. J, §§2, 7, are  
25 amended to read:

26 B. Private secondary schools approved for tui-  
27 tion whose school enrollments are at least 60%  
28 publicly-funded students as determined by the  
29 previous school year's October to April average  
30 enrollment; and

31 C. Schools operated by an agency of State Gov-  
32 ernment, including the following:

- 1 (1) Baxter School for the Deaf;  
2 (2) Arthur R. Gould School;  
3 (3) Pineland State (Berman School); and  
4 (4) Education of children in unorganized  
5 territories; and

11 This bill includes the Sweetser Childrens Home,  
12 Spurwink and Homestead Schools in the block grant  
13 teacher recognition program.

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
