20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22 23	21-A MRSA §354, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6, is amended to read:
24 25 26 27 28 29	2. <u>By whom signed.</u> A nomination petition may be signed only by <u>unenrolled</u> voters of the electoral di- vision which is to make the nomination, except that nomination petitions for presidential electors may be signed by any <u>unenrolled</u> Maine voter. Other signatures are void.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The purpose of this bill is to allow only 3 unenrolled but registered voters to sign nomination 4 petitions for candidates seeking nomination by peti-5 tion rather then through a party procedure.

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
