20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

23 24	§906. Unsafe transportation of hazardous materials or waste due to road or weather conditions
25 26 27 28 29 30 31	1. Definition. "Hazardous materials" or "hazardous waste" means any substance or materials defined by Title 38, section 1303 or Code of Federal Regulations, Title 49, Part 172, and is of a type and quantity that requires the vehicle to be marked or placarded in accordance with Code of Federal Regulations, Title 49, Part 177.823.

2. Rules. The Department of Transportation shall promulgate rules in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, providing for the creation and implementation by the department of a system which defines and designates certain portions of the interstate system unsafe for travel by motor vehicles carrying hazardous materials or hazardous waste due to road or weather conditions.

- 2-A. Notification. The rules shall provide for the immediate notification of the Chief of the State Police and the general public when such designations are made or rescinded. During the period of time that the interstate system is unsafe, all travel by motor vehicles carrying hazardous materials or hazardous waste is prohibited.
- 3. Unlawful act and warnings. Warnings for unlawful acts shall be issued pursuant to this subsection.
 - A. Unlawful act. It is unlawful for any person to operate a motor vehicle carrying hazardous materials or hazardous waste on the Maine Turnpike whenever the speed limit has been reduced due to road or weather conditions or on designated portions of the interstate system that have been declared unsafe by the Department of Transportation.
 - B. Warnings. The operator of a motor vehicle operated in violation of paragraph A shall not be issued a summons to court, but shall be issued a warning in the form designated by the Chief of the State Police. The warning shall state that the operator shall cause the motor vehicle to be removed from the Maine Turnpike or the interstate system at the next exit and that it shall not be operated again on the Maine Turnpike until the normal speed limit is restored or until the Department of Transportation designates it as safe. Failure to comply with the provisions of a warning issued pursuant to this paragraph is a violation of this section.
- 41 4. Penalty. A violation of this section is a 42 Class E crime.

Motor vehicles carrying hazardous materials or hazardous waste present a great danger to the health and safety of the public when involved in motor vehicle accidents. Accidents are more likely to occur on the Maine Turnpike and interstate system during inclement weather. This bill prohibits the transportation of dangerous materials on those highways when road and weather conditions make traveling unsafe.

The Department of Transportation is required to promulgate rules for implementation and also the dissemination of information concerning the program on the interstate system. The prohibition would be triggered by the reduction of the speed limit on the Maine Turnpike. Law enforcement officers will issue warnings to operators and instruct them to leave the highway at the next exit. Failure to do so will result in a Class E crime.
