1. Appointment. The Chief of the State Police Commissioner of Public Safety shall appoint a person who has knowledge of the various standard identification systems and Maine court procedure to be commanding officer Director of the State Bureau of Identification, heretofore established within the Bureau of State Police Department of Public Safety. The salary of the director shall be established by the commissioner in consultation with the Governor.

- 2. Personnel. The Commissioner of Public Safety, in consultation with the Chief of the State Police, may delegate members of the State Police to serve in the bureau upon request of the commanding efficer director. The commanding efficer shall have the authority to director may hire such civilian personnel, subject to the Civil Service Law and the approval of the Chief of the State Police commissioner, as he may deem considers necessary.
 - 3. Cooperation with other bureaus. The commanding efficer director shall cooperate with similar bureaus in other states and with the national bureau in the Department of Justice in Washington, D. C. and he shall develop and carry on an interstate, national and international system of identification.
 - 4. Rules. The commanding efficer director shall make and forward to all persons charged with any duty or responsibility under this section and sections 1542, 1544, 1547 and 15497, rules, regulations and forms for the taking, filing, preserving and distributing of fingerprints and other criminal history record information as provided in this chapter. Before becoming effective, such these rules, regulations and forms are to be approved by the Attorney General.
 - 5. Apparatus and materials. The Chief of the State Police Commissioner of Public Safety shall supply such the bureau with the necessary apparatus and materials for collecting, filing, preserving and distributing criminal history record information.

- 4. Duty to submit. It shall be the duty of the 2 head of the arresting agency, or his designee, 3 transmit, within 5 days of the date of arrest, to the 4 State Bureau of Identification the criminal finger-5 print record of any person whose fingerprints are 6 taken pursuant to subsection 1, paragraphs paragraph 7 A, B or C. The purpose of this bill is to remove the State Bureau of Identification from the position of a division within the Bureau of State Police. This bill places the State Bureau of Identification within the Department of Public Safety as a separate bureau with its own director.

Section 1 of the bill amends the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5 to place the Director of the State Bureau of Identification within the category of major policy-influencing positions within the Department of Public Safety.

Sections 2 and 3 of the bill amend the chapter establishing the State Bureau of Identification. The bureau is removed from the supervisory authority of the State Police and placed directly under the supervision of the Commissioner of Public Safety. The commanding officer of the bureau is replaced by a director

Section 4 of the bill places the State Bureau of Identification in the Department of Public Safety at an organizational level comparable to that of the Bureau of State Police, Office of the State Fire Marshal and Bureau of Liquor Enforcement.

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
