10	Amend the bill in section 3 in subsection 8 by
11	striking out all of the 2nd and 3rd paragraphs and
12	inserting in their place the following:
13	'Authority shall only be given to a municipality af-
14	ter a finding by the board that the municipality has
15	the capability and will fully execute all responsi-
16	bilities under applicable state law, will routinely
17	inspect and monitor licensed discharges within its
18 19	jurisdiction and will take enforcement action against those persons who violate discharge permit require-
20	ments.
21	Upon issuance of a license, a municipality shall for-
22	ward a copy of that license to the department within
23 24	5 working days. Within 30 days of the receipt of the
25	license by the department, any person aggrieved by the decision of the municipality, or the department,
26	may appeal to the board to reverse the decision of
27	the municipality.
28	Municipalities delegated authority pursuant to this
29	subsection may prescribe, by ordinance, standards for
30	the issuance of waste discharge licenses and for min-
31	imum performance and maintenance of treatment systems
32	as may be necessary to carry out the intent of this
33	subsection. No ordinance or other municipal law may
34	establish standards and procedures that are less
35	stringent than those required under relevant state
36	and federal law and departmental rule.
37	The Board of Environmental Protection may promulgate
38	rules governing the minimum requirements that shall

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1 2 3 4	control the licensing and enforcement of discharges by the municipalities. Included in these rules shall be a model ordinance which, if adopted by municipalities, will satisfy the requirements of the rules.
5	STATEMENT OF FACT
6 7 8 9 10 11	The original bill allowed municipalities to exercise an option to assume the responsibility for licensing, inspecting and enforcing certain waste water discharges currently regulated by the Department of Environmental Protection. This amendment clarifies the original bill by:
12	 Specifying general criteria which the munici-
13	pality must satisfy before authority is dele-
14	gated;
15	Providing for an appeal from a municipality's
16	decision on a discharge license;
17	 Requiring municipal ordinances to be at least
18	as stringent as state and federal law; and
19	 Providing for adoption of rules by the board,
20	including a model ordinance for municipalities.
