17 18 19 20	AN ACT to Amend the Laws Concerning Extension of Motor Vehicle Registration Expiration Dates.
21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23 24	29 MRSA §106, sub-§2, ¶B, as repealed and re- placed by PL 1979, c. 664, is amended to read:
25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33	B. Except as herein provided, when application for registration of an automobile, motor truck, or truck tractor is made after the registration for the previous year has been the expired for more than 30 days, the expiration date of the re- newal shall be at the end of the month, one year from the month of issuance of the previous regis- tration. If the applicant provides satisfactory evidence and certifies in writing to the Secre-

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tary of State that the vehicle has not been operated on a public way during the period of the expired registration, the registration expiration date, upon renewal, is at the end of the month one year from the month of issuance of the registration renewal.

STATEMENT OF FACT

8 The purpose of this bill is to repeal the provi-9 sion of law which permits an extension of the motor 10 vehicle registration expiration date upon a showing 11 that the vehicle has not been operated on a public 12 way. This provision is currently being abused by many 13 people.

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
