The number of Repre-11 12 13 sentatives shall be divided into the number of inhabitants of the State, exclusive of foreigners not nat-14 uralized according to the latest Federal Decennial 15 16 Census or a State Census previously ordered by the 17 Legislature to coincide with the Federal Decennial 18 Census, to determine a median population figure for each Representative District. Each Representative 19 District shall be formed of contiguous and compact 20 21 territory and shall cross political subdivision lines 22 least number of times necessary to establish as the nearly as practicable equally populated districts. 23 Whenever the population of a municipality entitles it 24 25 to more than one district, all whole districts shall 26 be drawn within municipal boundaries. Any population remainder within the municipality shall be included 27 a district drawn to cross the municipal boundary, 28 in 29 provided that such population remainder of the municipality must be contiguous to another municipality or 30 municipalities included in the district. 31

Resolved: That the city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors 34 of 35 this State shall notify the inhabitants of their re-36 spective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in 37 the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, 38 on the Tuesday 39 following the first Monday of November following the 40 passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratifi-41 cation of the amendment proposed in this resolution 42 by voting upon the following question:

The Governor shall review the re-13 turns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal 14 votes are in favor of the amendment, the Governor 15 shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amend-16 ment shall become part of the Constitution on the 17 date of the proclamation.

18 Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare 19 20 and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution neces-21 22 sary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

STATEMENT OF FACT

24 This constitutional resolution staggers the 25 4-year terms of office for Representatives. Accord-26 ing to this resolution, Representatives in odd-27 numbered districts would be elected to 4-year terms 28 of office beginning in 1988, and Representatives in even-numbered districts would be elected to 4-year 29 30 terms of office beginning in 1990.
