management, adult day health, personal care, homemaker, home health, transportation, emergency response systems and mental health services. Approximately 70% will be funded by federal funds and 30% by state funds. The State's match has come from the State's home based care program during year one and year 2, which has reduced the amount of service dollars to non-Medicaid eligible frail older persons. These funds are necessary in order not to erode the home based care program's flexibility and effectiveness in serving those individuals still ineligible for the waiver, but who are in need of home care.
