## STATE OF MAINE SENATE 113TH LEGISLATURE FIRST REGULAR SESSION

7 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 87, L.D. 173, 8 "RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitu-9 tion of Maine to Change the Terms of Members of the 10 Senate from 2 Years to 4 Years."

Amend the resolution by striking out all of section 1 (page 1, lines 12 to 16 and page 2 lines 1 to 7 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

14 'Section 1. Number of Secators. The Senate 15 shall consist of an odd number of Senators, not less 16 than 31 nor more than 35, elected at the same time as 17 Representatives by the qualified electors of the dis-18 tricts into which the State shall be from time to 19 time divided. The term of office for Senators shall 20 be for 2 years, except as provided in this section. 21 Reginning with the general elections to be held in 1988, Senators shall be elected to 4-year terms.'

Further amend the resolution by striking out all of the question (page 2, lines 19 to 23 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

26 ' "Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended to 27 establish 4-year terms of office for Senators in odd-28 numbered districts beginning in 1988?" '
