STATE OF MAINE IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Change the Terms of Members of the Senate from 2 Years to 4 Years. Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED: Two thirds each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of be proposed: Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. Second, §1 is repealed and the following enacted in its place: Section 1. Number of Senators. The Senate shall consist of an odd number of Senators, not less than 31 nor more than 35, elected at the same time as Rep-

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resentatives by the qualified electors of the dis-

tricts into which the State shall be from time to

time divided. The term of office for Senators shall be for 2 years, except as provided in this section. Beginning with the general elections to be held in 1988, Senators in the odd-numbered districts shall be elected to 4-year terms. In 1990, Senators in the even-numbered districts shall be elected to 4-year terms.

Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended to establish 4-year terms of office for Senators in odd-numbered districts beginning in 1988, and 4-year terms of office for Senators in even-numbered districts beginning in 1990?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment shall become part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation.

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.
