1 AN ACT Relating to a Vocational Region
2 as Defined by Law.
3

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
5 follows:

6 20-A MRSA §8301, sub-§5, as amended by PL 1983,
7 c. 485, §26, is further amended to read:

8 5. Vocational region. A vocational region is
9 comprised of all the school administrative units
10 within the geographical boundaries established in
11 section 8451. A region shall be governed by a coop-
12 erative board formed in accordance with section 8452.
13 A region is a school administrative unit authorized
14 to provide vocational education to eligible students
15 as established under section 8305.

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This bill clarifies the purpose and organization-
3 al status of the vocational region as a
4 state-approved unit of school administration. This
5 change is necessary to make clear that a vocational
6 region is an administrative unit because the binding
7 laws as they cross reference throughout the Revised
8 Statutes, Title 20-A, refer to the term "administra-
9 tive unit" and it is necessary to establish the com-
10 fort of law to clarify the authority to issue bonds.
