1 2 3 4	AN ACT to Amend the Law Concerning Handicapped Motor Vehicle Registrations.
5 6	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
7 8 9	Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §252, first \P , as amended by PL 1985, c. 325, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
10 11 12 13 14 15	On annual application to the Secretary of State, any handicapped person shall be issued a special designating placard to be fixed to the sun visor of a motor vehicle properly registered in this State. In these cases, the placard may be displayed only during the time when the handicapped person is the driver of the vehicle, when the handicapped person is a passen-

ger in a vehicle, when the driver of the vehicle is transporting the handicapped person or when the driver is waiting for a service to be rendered to the handicapped person. The placard issued under this section shall bear the name of the handicapped person. A \$1 fee shall be charged for the placard.

 - Any person other than a handicapped person or the spease of a handicapped person issued a set of special designating plates or placard under this section shall be subject to a \$100 fine for use of the special designating plates or placard. The special designating plates or placard shall be suspended if improper use is permitted.

 - Secretary of State on application and upon evidence of payment of the excise tax required by Title 36, section 1482 shall issue a registration certificate and set of special designating plates to be used in lieu of regular registration plates 100% disabled veteran who served in the United States Armed Forces in a combat zone at any time during his tenure of service when that application is accompanied by certification from the United States Veterans Administration as to the veteran's disability and receipt of 100% service-connected benefits and that the veteran is permanently confined to a wheelchair or restricted to the use of crutches or braces or otherwise handicapped in such a way that his mobility is seriously restricted and a copy of the appropriate military form certifying combat duty service.
 - These special designating plates shall bear the International Symbol, easily recognizable at a distance, and the letters VET which indicates that the vehicle is owned by a disabled veteran.

- Temporary handicapped placards shall be of a design and color established by the Secretary of State and the placards shall show the expiration date specified by the physician who prepared the prescription request.

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Whenever any person, firm or corporation, after applying for and receiving a registration for any motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer, shall move from the address named in such application or in the registration issued, or when the name of the holder of such registration is changed by marriage or otherwise, such person, firm or corporation shall within

STATEMENT OF FACT

Section 1 of the bill eliminates the chronic misuse and abuse by persons not entitled to park in designated handicapped spaces throughout the State.

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Section 2 is to allow this paragraph to coincide with the change in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29, section 252, first paragraph, which eliminates the word plate and insures the placard is issued only to the handicapped person.

Section 3 is to restrict the use of "handicapped" plates for veterans to those veterans whose physical mobility is restricted as a result of service in combat zones. Currently, the law requires that whenever veteran is certified by the United States Veterans Administration as 100% disabled, the State is required to provide "handicapped" plates to eligible Current law also requires the disability veterans. been incurred in a combat zone. to have In some cases, veterans are not physically handicapped or impaired, but they are certified as 100% disabled the United States Veterans Administration. As a result, members of the general public criticize the distribution of "handicapped" registration plates to United States veterans.

Section 4 is to differentiate between a regular placard and a temporary placard issued.

Section 5 is to bring this section of the law in line with the change in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 252, which eliminates plates from the handicap law. Otherwise a conflict would result.

1	Section 6 eliminates any nonlicensed persons from
2	operating these type vehicles. Currently, the law is
3 4	worded in such a way that an individual of any age may operate the vehicle.

Section 7 is to require a change of name or address to be reported to the Secretary of State within 10 days.

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
