STATE OF MAINE IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN AN ACT Relating to Lands within Indian Territory. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 12 MRSA §682, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1973, c. 569, §2, is further amended to read: 1. Unorganized and deorganized areas. Unorganized and deorganized areas shall include all areas located within the jurisdiction of the State of Maine, except areas located within organized cities

and towns, and within Indian reservations territory.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

The Indian reservations of the State were ex-
empted from the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission
jurisdiction at the time the commission was created
since they had an organized government capable of
making ordinances, as they still do. Since the defi-
nition of Indian territory in the Maine Revised Stat-
utes, Title 30, section 6205, includes the reserva-
tions plus other lands purchased within certain town-
ships named in that section, this bill makes Title
12, section 682, subsection 1 consistent with An Act
to Implement the Maine Indian Claims Settlement.

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
