<u>4</u> 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
6 7 8	38 MRSA §590, as amended by PL 1985, c. 745, §§1 and 2, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:
9 10	Licenses shall be issued by the board for terms of 5 years.
11	STATEMENT OF FACT

7	Under current practice, the Department of Envi-
2	ronmental Protection issues air licenses for 2 years.
3	The Environmental Protection Agency has indicated
4	that most states in the Environmental Protection
5	Agency Region I either have a much longer term or no
6	term at all. The present practice of having licenses
7.	expire after 2 years has resulted in licensees oper-
8	ating without current licenses for as long as 7
9	years. The small benefits to be gained by allowing
10	an agency to theoretically look at a license every 2
11	years is far outweighed by the negative consequences
12	of most companies in the State having expired li-
13	censes, unnecessary diversion of resources seeking to
14	relicense major facilities every 2 years and the in-
15	ability to offer licenses of a duration competitive
16	with other states in the region. Since waste dis-
17	charge licenses issued by the Department of Environ-
18	mental Protection are typically for a 5-year period,
19	this bill will align air and water licensing.
