- Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
- 7 Whereas, this legislation provides that eligible 8 law students who are nonresidents attending an Ameri-9 can Bar Association approved law school, which is 10 outside the State, may appear in court on behalf of 11 this State or its agencies or may provide legal ser-
- this State or its agencies or may provide legal services for the indigent; and
 - Whereas, it is the purpose of this legislation to permit these students to undertake this type of em-

- ployment this summer and to gain needed legal experience which can benefit the people of the State; and
- Whereas, unless enacted as an emergency, this bill may not take effect until the summer is partially over, a situation which would deprive these students of summer jobs this year and partially frustrate the purpose of this legislation; and

- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- 18 Notwithstanding any of the other provisions of 19 this chapter and under such terms, conditions, 20 tations, qualifications and supervision as the Su-21 preme Judicial Court shall by rule require, a 22 law student in a law school in this State approved by 23 the American Bar Association or a senior law student 24 who is a Maine resident and who is enrolled in a 25 school which is in another state and an eligible law 26 student who is enrolled in a law school which is 27 proved by the American Bar Association, may appear in 28 the courts of the State on behalf of the State or an 29 agency thereof, or under the supervision of an 30 nization providing legal services to the indigent approved by the Supreme Judicial Court on behalf of an 31 32 individual receiving services through such organiza-33 tion.
 - Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

2 Current law permits senior law students who 3 Maine residents and who attend out-of-state American Bar Association approved law schools and nonresident 4 5 senior law students who attend the University of 6 Maine law school to appear in court under supervision 7 as provided by rules promulgated by the Supreme Judi-8 cial Court. Prohibiting nonresident senior law 9 dents who attend out-of-state American Bar Association approved law schools from benefiting from the 10 11 present rules is of doubtful constitutionality. 12 The purpose of this bill is to enable the Supreme 13 Judicial Court to provide by rule that eligible non-14 resident law students attending out-of-state American 15 Bar Association approved law schools be allowed to 16 appear in court under appropriate supervision. This 17 bill would not only resolve any constitutional ques-18 tions, but would also make available to public prose-
