AN ACT to Establish a Dependent Care Tax

4 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
6 7	36 MRSA §5127, sub-§2, as repealed and replaced by PL 1985, c. 766, §1, is amended to read:
8 9 .0 .1 .2 .3	2. Income tax credit for child and adult dependent care expenses. A resident individual shall be allowed a credit against the tax otherwise due under this Part for child and adult dependent care expenses in the amount of 16% of the federal tax credit allowable for child care expenses in tax year 1986; 20% of the federal tax credit allowable for child care ex-
.5 .6	penses in tax year 1987; and 25% of the federal tax credit allowable for child care expenses thereafter.

1 2 .	In no case will this credit reduce the Maine income tax to less than zero.
3	STATEMENT OF FACT
4 5 6 7 8	The purpose of this bill is to extend the Maine income tax credit for child care expenses to include adult dependent care expenses as well. This bill will encourage more persons to care for older relatives or disabled adults at home.
