Resolve, Concerning State Government  
Reorganization.

4 Commission to study State Government reorganiza-  
5 tion. Resolved: That there is established the Com-  
6 mission on State Government Reorganization. The com-  
7 mission shall consist of the following members: One  
8 Senator, who is a member of the majority political  
9 party in the Senate and a member of the Joint Stand-  
10 ing Committee on State and Local Government or the  
11 Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Finan-  
12 cial Affairs, appointed by the President of the Sen-  
13 ate; one Senator, who is a member of the minority pol-  
14 itical party in the Senate and a member of the Joint  
15 Standing Committee on State and Local Government or  
16 the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and  
17 Financial Affairs, appointed by the Senate Minority  
18 Leader; one member of the House of Representatives,

1 who is a member of the majority political party in  
2 the House of Representatives and a member of the  
3 Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Govern-  
4 ment or the Joint Standing Committee on Appropria-  
5 tions and Financial Affairs, appointed by the Speaker  
6 of the House of Representatives; one member of the  
7 House of Representatives, who is a member of the mi-  
8 nority political party in the House of Representa-  
9 tives and a member of the Joint Standing Committee on  
10 State and Local Government or the Joint Standing Com-  
11 mittee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs, ap-  
12 pointed by the House Minority Leader; 2 state career  
13 employees appointed by the Governor; 8 members from  
14 private business appointed by the Governor from among  
15 names submitted to the Governor by business organiza-  
16 tions throughout the State; and be it further

17 Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall in-  
18 vestigate possible integration or elimination of  
19 state programs, departments and agencies, including,  
20 but not limited to, the elimination of duplication in  
21 services and programs; and be it further

22 Report. Resolved: That the commission shall re-  
23 port its findings, together with any implementing  
24 legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the  
25 113th Legislature; and be it further

26 Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the  
27 commission shall not receive compensation.

28 STATEMENT OF FACT

29 The purpose of this resolve is to establish a  
30 commission to study possible integration or elimina-  
31 tion of state programs, departments and agencies.

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
