Violation. It is unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to distribute or sell cigarettes by the use of a vending machine or to install or maintain a vending machine with the intent to make such sales. Any person, firm or corporation which performs such an act commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 may be adjudged.

11 This section shall not apply to any vending ma-12 chine located in an area where minors are not allowed 13 by law or by policy of the owner of the premises.
