1 2 3	AN ACT to Improve Flexibility in the Counting of Ballots.
4 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
6	21-A MRSA §695, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1985, c.
7	383, §12, is further amended to read:
8	2. <u>Separated into lots</u> . In counting the bal-
9	lots, the election clerks shall separate them into
10	distinct lots. Each of these lots must consist of
11	50 <u>or 100</u> ballots, except for one lot, which may have
12	less than 50 <u>or 100</u> ballots. <u>Each municipal clerk</u>
13	<u>must determine the lot size to be used for each elec-</u>
14	tion prior to the close of the polls on election day.
15	<u>They The election clerks</u> shall place with each lot a
16	statement of the count in that lot and the names of

1 the election clerks who made the count. They shall 2 wrap the statement of the count around the outside of 3 each lot of ballots.

STATEMENT OF FACT

5 Some municipal clerks have found it less conve-6 nient to count in groups of 50 than in previously es-7 tablished standards of 100. This bill allows the op-8 tions of choosing the most convenient group size 9 while maintaining standard counting procedures which 10 are especially useful in case a recount is necessary.
