## AN ACT Relating to the Use of Hospital Records of Blood-alcohol Level in Court Procedures as Evidence of Liability.

6 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 7 follows:

8 16 MRSA §357, as amended by PL 1973, c. 788, §66,
9 is further amended to read:

10 §357. Hospital records and copies of records

Records kept by hospitals and other medical facilities licensed under the laws of this State and records which the court finds are required to be kept by the laws of any other state or territory, or the District of Columbia, or by the laws and regulations

1 of the United States of America pertaining to the De-2 partment of National Defense and the Veterans Adminз istration, by hospitals and other medical facilities 4 similarly conducted or operated or which, being incorporate, offer treatment free of charge, shall be admissible, as evidence in the courts of this State 5 6 7 so far as such records relate to the treatment and 8 medical history of such those cases and the court 9 shall admit copies of such those records, if certi-10 fied by the persons in custody thereof to be true and complete, but nothing therein contained shall be ad-11 12 missible as evidence which has reference to the guestion of liability. Copies of photographic or micro-photographic records so kept by hospitals and medical 13 14 15 facilities, when duly certified by the person in 16 charge of the hospital and other medical facility, 17 shall be admitted in evidence equally with the origi-18 nal photographs or microphotographs.

19 Notwithstanding this section, records indicating 20 the presence of intoxicating liquor or drugs in a 21 person are admissible as evidence on the question of 22 that person's liability.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow the introduction of evidence of intoxication into court procedures in questions of liability. This evidence would come from hospital records.
