STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Administrative Council of the University of Maine System.

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 5 follows:

Sec. 1. 1 MRSA §402, sub-§2, ¶B, as amended by PL 1985, c. 695, §1 and c. 779, §1, is further amended to read:

> B. Any board or commission of any state agency or authority, the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System and any of its committees and subcommittees, the administrative council of the University of Maine System, the Board of Trustees of the Maine Maritime Academy and any of its committees and subcommittees, the Board of Trustees of the Maine Vocational-Technical Insti-

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- tute System and any of its committees and subcommittees; and
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Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §1578, sub-§3, ¶B, as amended by PL 1985, c. 779, §61, is further amended to read:

B. Any board or commission of any state agency or authority, the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System and any of its committees and subcommittees, the Administrative Council of the University of Maine System, the Board of Trustees of the Maine Maritime Academy and any of its committees and subcommittees; and

12 Sec. 3. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-A, as enacted by 13 P&SL 1967, c. 229, §3, is further amended to read:

14 Sec. 4-A. Administration; chancellor; campus 15 heads; advisory committees. The board of trustees shall appoint a chancellor of the university who 16 17 shall serve at its pleasure and be chief administra-18 tive and education officer thereof. The chancellor 19 may maintain an office at Augusta and such other of-20 fices as the board of trustees may designate. The chancellor shall nominate and the board of trustees 21 22 shall appoint the persons to head the various campuses and shall give said the persons such titles 23 as 24 shall be deemed appropriate. The head of a campus shall not serve concurrently as chancellor or 25 as а 26 member of the board of trustees. An administrative council composed of the heads of each institution 27 shall be formed. The board of trustees shall appoint 28 29 advisory committees on behalf of the various such 30 campuses and such other advisory committees as may 31 appear desirable.

32 Sec. 4. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-B, as enacted by 33 P&SL 1967, c. 229, §3, is amended to read:

34 Sec. 4-B. Duties of the board of trustees, chan-35 cellor and heads of the various campuses.

36 1. Board of trustees; duties. The board of 37 trustees, in consultation with the chancellor, shall 38 be the governing and planning body of the university 39 and in addition shall have responsibility for prepar-40 ing and approving the operating and capital budgets

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of the university and presenting them in accordance with the direction in Title 5, section 1665, and Title 5, chapter 153.

2. Chancellor; duties. The chancellor shall exercise such powers and fulfill such responsibilities as shall be delegated by the board.

3. Head of each campus; duties. The head of each campus shall be the chief administrative and educational officer thereof and shall be responsible for the day to day operation and development of its academic program within the limits defined by the board of trustees and the chancellor; and in addition, shall exercise such rights and privileges as are generally recognized in the administering of admissions, curriculum development, extra curricular programs, long rang range planning within the framework of the overall university plan, and supervision of faculty.

4. Administrative council. The administrative council shall exercise the following responsibilities. To make to the board of trustees, through the chancellor, recommendations which require board action or pertain to policy development; serve as a clearing house for matters referred to it by appropriate officers of individual institutions; act on matters referred to the council by the chancellor or the board of trustees.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to eliminate statutory reference to the administrative council of the University of Maine System. The existing language is obsolete in that the council as a body no longer carries out the functions foreseen when the university system was created.

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
