IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Organization and Powers of Religious Societies.

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

6 13 MRSA §2982, as amended by PL 1975, c. 244, is 7 further amended to read:

Officers as corporations; organization §2982. and powers

The church wardens of Episcopal churches, the stewards or trustees of the United Methodist church and the deacons of all other Protestant churches are so far corporations as to take, in succession, all grants and gifts of real and personal estate made to

1 their churches or to them and their successors. If 2 the ministers, elders or vestrymen are joined with them in such grants or gifts, the 2 classes of offi-3 4 cers shall be corporations for that purpose. For the 5 purpose of organizing any such corporation, one or 6 more members of said the corporation may call a meet-7 ing thereof by a notice posted upon the outer door of 8 the meetinghouse or place of public worship of their 9 parish or society at least 7 days before the time of 10 holding such meeting; or, if there is no such 11 meetinghouse or place of public worship, by a notice 12 posted in 2 public and conspicuous places in the town wherein said parish or society is located. At such 13 14 meeting the corporation may organize, adopt a corpo-15 rate name and elect such officers as its bylaws shall 16 prescribe. Said These corporations are authorized to may take by gift, purchase, bequest, demise or other-17 wise, real and personal property for religious pur-18 and may make such contracts in relation to 19 poses, such estate, its improvements, disposal, 20 investment 21 reinvestment, as they may be authorized under the or 22 rules of their church or instructed by the church for which they hold estate in trust to make, which con-23 24 tracts may be enforced by or against them as in other 25 cases. No disposal of such estate shall may be made, 26 inconsistent with the terms of the grant by which it 27 the local United Methodist is held. Trustees of 28 churches are created a corporation with all the 29 rights and privileges of corporations, subject to the 30 restrictions contained in the book of discipline of 31 the United Methodist church.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill removes certain statutory language relating to organization and powers of religious societies. This language makes discipline a part of the law. The book of discipline is subject to change without action by the Legislature and should not be incorporated by reference into the law.
