Resolve, to Compensate Lucille A. Clavette of Sabattus as Personal Representative of the Estate of Richard J. Clavette,

Late of Pownal.

Lucille A. Clavette, as personal representative of the estate of Richard J. Clavette; compensated by the State. Resolved: That the Governor of the State

9 is authorized and directed, upon receipt of the nec-10 essary releases, to pay \$65,000, from funds appropri-11 ated therefor, to Lucille A. Clavette as personal

12 representative of the estate of Richard J. Clavett

as compensation for the death of Richard J. Clavette.

The \$65,000 payment authorized by this resolve shall be in full satisfaction of any and all claims by the

estate of Richard J. Clavette against the State and its employees for the death of Richard J. Clavette.

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Richard J. Clavette died on or about February 21, 1986, while he was a resident of the Pineland Center in Pownal. Mr. Clavette had wandered off the Pineland Center premises on the morning of Friday, February 21, 1986, and was not found until the afternoon of Sunday, February 23, 1986. The state medical examiner fixed the time of death as the evening of February 21, 1986.

Clavette is Richard J. Clavette's 10 Lucille Α. mother and the personal representative of his estate. 11 12 She alleges that the negligence of the State and its 13 employees was the proximate cause of her son's death. 14 inquiry panel, appointed by Kevin W. Concannon, Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, 15 16 found that throughout the search for Mr. Clavette. 17 major systems failures and serious errors in judgment 18 did occur. The inquiry panel further found that there were substantive problems regarding administrative 19 20 leadership and continuity of command, that communica-21 tions broke down severely on several levels during the search and that the Pineland Center's own missing 22 and lost resident search policy was not followed. The 23 24 inquiry panel specifically found if the search policy 25 had been followed, the search effort would have been conducted in a more realistic manner and Mr. Clavette 26 27 might have been found before he died. In addition, 28 the panel concluded that the Clavette family was not 29 well served during the obviously stressful time while 30 Mr. Clavette was missing and recommended that one 31 state employee be dismissed, another be demoted, an-32 other's salary be reduced, another be suspended for a 33 period and 3 others receive written reprimands.

Lucille A. Clavette, as personal representative of the estate of Richard J. Clavette is barred by law from bringing any action against the State and its employees for the wrongful death of Richard J. Clavette. Because of the unique circumstances of this case, the Legislature feels that the State has a moral obligation to compensate Lucille A. Clavette, as personal representative of the estate of Richard J. Clavette directly for the death of Richard Clavette. This resolve authorizes and directs, upon the receipt
