1Provides funds for in-2dependent living ser-3vices and Home Based4Care for nonelderly.

STATEMENT OF FACT

6 Bureau of Rehabilitation statistics indicate that 7 56 people are on waiting lists for independent living 8 services. Approximately 174 people will not receive 9 services unless these funds are made available.

10 Additionally, 70 persons under 60 years of age 11 will not be able to remain in their own homes because Home Based Care funds for nonelderly persons are not 12 available. The cost of institutionalization is far 13 more than the average cost of in-home care as cur-14 15 rently provided by the bureau. Appropriation of 16 these funds results in a significant long-term sav-17 ings to the taxpayer.
