Facilities.

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
5 follows:

6 4 MRSA §115, first ¶, as amended by PL 1981, c.
7 647; §1, is further amended to read:

8 In each county, the place for holding court shall
9 be located in a building designated by the Chief Jus-
10 tice of the Supreme Judicial Court or his designee,
11 who, with the advice and approval of the Bureau of
12 Public Improvements, is empowered to negotiate, on
13 behalf of the State, the leases, contracts and other
14 arrangements he considers necessary, within the lim-
15 its of appropriations and other funds available to
16 the Supreme Judicial and Superior Courts, to provide

1 suitable quarters, adequately furnished and equipped,
2 for the Supreme Judicial or Superior Court in each
3 county. The county commissioners in each county
4 shall continue to provide for the use of the Supreme
5 Judicial and Superior Courts such quarters, facili-
6 ties, furnishings and equipment in existing county
7 buildings as were in use on January 17, 1976, without
8 charge.

9 STATEMENT OF FACT

10 The purpose of this bill is to bring the require-
11 ments for the use of county facilities by the Supreme
12 Judicial Court and the Superior Courts into conformi-
13 ty with the requirements for such use by the District
14 Courts.
