3 4	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
5	22 MRSA §1579-A is enacted to read:
6	§1579-A. Smoking in food stores and restaurants
7 8 9	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
0 1 2 3	A. "Restaurant" means any enclosed indoor restaurant or other enclosed indoor establishment which invites the public to be served food for
ب	consumption on the premises.

B. "Retail food store" means any store with a public area of 1,500 square feet or more which sells articles used for food or drink for consumption off the store's premises.
5 C. "Smoking" includes being in possession of or responsible for a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe or any other lighted smoking equipment.

A. Restaurants shall display prominently, at or near the entrance, a sign indicating their policy on seating for smokers and nonsmokers, and shall encourage their patrons to make their seating requests known.
B. Retail food stores shall display prominently, at or near the entrance, a sign notifying members of the public that no smoking is allowed.
19 <u>3. Provision of no-smoking area in restaurants.</u> 20 <u>Restaurants shall provide a no-smoking area.</u>
21 <u>4. Smoking prohibited in retail food stores.</u> 22 <u>Smoking is prohibited in all retail food stores as defined in this section.</u>
5. Violation. Any person who violates this section commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture not to exceed \$100 may be adjudged.

2 3 4 5 6	This bill accommodates the 63% of the Maine population that does not smoke by requiring that restaurants provide a no smoking area for their patrons and post notice of their policy. The bill also prohibits
7 8	smoking in retail food stores with a public area of 1,500 square feet or more and also requires posting of that policy. The bill provides a \$100 forfeiture
9 10	for any violation of the smoking policies for restaurants and retail food stores.
