Whereas, recently introduced legislation requires that all restaurants have public rest rooms beginning January 1, 1987; and

Whereas, such facilities would represent a considerable expense in construction costs, maintenance and space for restaurants; and

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2 3	whereas, the requirement for such facilities is a particular hardship for already established restaurants; and
4 5	Whereas, many restaurants have not had sufficient time to comply with the law; and
6 7 8 9 10	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

The toilets provided shall be clearly marked, maintained in a sanitary condition and in good repair. There shall be no charge for their use. Lavatory facilities shall be located within or immediately adjacent to all toilet rooms or vestibules.

9 10 11 12	The Department of Human Services may adopt, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, rules to administer this chapter and thereby protect the public health.
13	§1688. Enforcement
14 15 16 17 18 19	This chapter shall be enforced by the Division of Health Engineering. Anyone violating this chapter or rules under this chapter commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not more than \$200 may be adjudged. Each day of violation shall be considered a separate offense.
20 21 22 23	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved, except that section 2 of the Act shall take effect July 1, 1987.
