IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend the Law to Allow Security Officers to be on Duty for Dances at Which Minors are Admitted.

5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 6 follows:

8 MRSA §161, first ¶, as repealed and replaced by **PL** 1967, **c.** 265, is amended to read:

No public dances at which minors are admitted shall may be held in any pavilion, hall or other buildings unless there shall be on hand at all times, when such dances are being held, an officer of the law or a private security guard, as licensed pursuant to Title 32, chapter 93, and unless there shall be in such pavilion, hall or other building separate toilets for men and women. This paragraph shall not ap-
