14 Act will put greater training requirements and financial burdens on the State's water systems. 15 eral suppliers may need to construct new filtration 16 17 plants and to train personnel to operate them. 18 this appropriation, the Maine Rural Water Association 19 will be able to fulfill these new training needs of the State's water suppliers and to help communities 20 21 secure the necessary financing for new facilities.
