### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Temporarily Extend Authority for Agricultural Central Filing Systems.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

7 Whereas, provisions of the United States Food Se-8 curity Act of 1985, Public Law 99-198, Section 1324, 9 provide for the Secretary of State of every state to 10 establish and operate a central filing system for the 11 recording of notices of security interests in farm 12 products; and

Whereas, in the absence of such a central state filing system which meets the criteria of the United

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States Food Security Act of 1985, Public Law 99-198, 1 Section 1324, federal law provides that security 2 in-3 terests in farm products cannot be protected or ef-4 fective as to dealers or others in the business of 5 those products unless lenders give direct purchasing 6 notice of their security interests to all such buy-7 ers; and

8 Whereas, agricultural lenders in Maine have indi-9 cated their strong preference for a central filing 10 system over direct notice; and

11 Whereas, if Maine fails to provide the central 12 filing system contemplated by this federal law, the 13 availability of farm financing in this State will be 14 jeopardized; and

15 Whereas, since the federal law becomes effective 16 in December 1986, immediate action is required by the 17 Secretary of State in order to develop, operate and 18 implement the central filing system; and

19 the appropriation provided in this Act Whereas, 20 will allow the Secretary of State to develop, operate 21 and implement the required system for security inter-22 ests in farm products in conjunction with needed ef-23 forts to computerize and modernize the Secretary of 24 State's system for recording other Uniform Commercial 25 Code financing statements; and

26 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 27 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 28 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 29 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-30 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 31 therefore,

32 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 33 follows:

34 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §90, 2nd ¶ as enacted by PL 1985, 35 c. 824, §1, is amended to read:

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This section is repealed on February May 1, 1987.

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Sec. 2. 11 MRSA §9-401, sub-§(1), ¶(a-1), as enacted by PL 1985, c. 824, §2, is amended to read:

(a-1.) When the collateral is farm products, a filing may be made with the Secretary of State in accordance with procedures adopted under Title 5, section 90. This paragraph is repealed on February May 1, 1987.

8 Sec. 3. Retroactivity; application. This Act 9 shall apply retroactively to February 1, 1987. The 10 service provided by the Secretary of State as a cen-11 tral filing system shall be deemed to have continued 12 uninterrupted upon passage of this Act.

13 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 14 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-15 proved.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

17 Public Law 1985, chapter 824 placed a "sunset" 18 date on the new agricultural filing system of Febru-19 ary 1, 1987, to insure proper legislative review of 20 the new activity. Since detailed legislation will 21 not be passed by that deadline, this bill temporarily 22 extends the sunset date to May 1, 1987.

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
