1 2	AN ACT to Expand the Adoption Registry.
3 4	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
5 6 7	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §2706-A, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 384, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
8 9 10	2. Registration. The following persons may register their names and addresses with the state registrar and request contact:
11	A. Adopted persons, custodians and guardians:
12	(1) An adopted person 18 years old or more;

1 2 3 4 5		(2) A person 18 years old or more whose adoption was annulled or whose adoptive parents surrendered and released parental rights to him or whose parental rights were terminated;
6 7 8 9		(3) The legal custodian of a person whose adoption was annulled, or who was surrendered and released by his adoptive parents or whose parental rights were terminated;
10 11 12 13		(4) The legal custodian of an adopted child who has been removed from the custody or guardianship of his adoptive parents by order of a court; and
14 15 16		(5) A legal guardian of an adult adopted person who has been determined by the court to be incapacitated;

4 5 6	(1) The legal custodian of a minor child who was freed for adoption, but was never subsequently adopted.

9 10 11 12	3-A. Providing information about available counseling support. The state registrar shall provide information about sources of counseling support to any person registering or requesting contact.
13 14	Sec. 3. 22 MRSA §2706-A, sub-§5, as amended by PL 1985, c. 673, is further amended to read:

When the state registrar has a request for contact from both a biological parent and that parent's adopted child or the child's adoptive parent any 2 persons specified in subsection 2 related to the same adoption, he shall notify each party of the name and address of the other party and of sources of counseling support. If a biological parent, an adoptive parent or an adopted person registered under this section has made a request for contact and the party being sought died in Maine, the state registrar may disclose to the requesting party the fact that the biological parent, adoptive parent or the adopted person has died.
28	STATEMENT OF FACT
29 30 31 32	The adoption registry currently provides that only adult adopted persons, adoptive parents on behalf of minor adoptees and biological parents may register for a possible reunion.
33 34 35 36	This bill broadens the categories to allow for registration by other persons who would otherwise be foreclosed from registering and thereby making contact, including people whose adoption was annulled,
