16	STATEMENT OF FACT
17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26	This amendment allows residents to train up to 4 dogs on bear within the month of August. It is limited to residents because of the high incidence of nuisance complaints involving nonresidents. Also, since the bill would make Maine one of the few states in the region that allows training of bear dogs; there would be an influx of out-of-state trainers if it was not limited to residents. Washington and Hancock Counties were excluded due to potential conflicts with blueberry harvesters.
