8 Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §931, first ¶, as enacted by PL
9 1985, c. 294, §§2 and 3, is amended to read:

10 The State Board of Arbitration and Conciliation,
11 in this subchapter called the "board," shall consist
12 of 3 members appointed by the Governor, from time to
13 time upon the expiration of the terms of the several
14 members, for terms of 3 years. One member shall be
15 an employer of labor or selected from some associa-
16 tion representing employers of labor, and another
17 shall be an employee or selected from some bona fide
18 trade or labor union. The 3rd member shall be chair-
19 man of the board and shall represent the public in-
20 terests of the State. Vacancies occurring during a
21 term shall be filled for the unexpired term. Mem-
22 bers of the board shall each receive ~~\$50~~ \$75 a day
23 for their services for the time actually employed in
24 the discharge of their official duties. They shall
25 receive their traveling and all other necessary ex-
26 penses. The costs for services rendered and expenses
27 incurred by the State Board of Arbitration and Con-
28 ciliation shall be paid by the State from an appro-
29 priation for the board which shall be included in the
30 budget of the Maine Labor Relations Board. Authori-
31 zation for services rendered and expenditures in-
32 curred by the State Board of Arbitration and Concili-
33 ation shall be the responsibility of the Executive
34 Director of the Maine Labor Relations Board who
35 shall, annually, on or before July 1st, make a report
36 of the activities of the State Board of Arbitration
37 and Conciliation to the Governor. The board shall
38 from time to time make rules of procedure as it deems
39 necessary.
