### STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Provide for a Replacement Moose Permit when Infected Animals are Taken.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

12 MRSA §7463-A, sub-§10-A is enacted to read:

10-A. Replacement permit. If, at the time a moose is presented for inspection at a registration station, a state biologist finds the moose to be infected with Taenia Krabbei, Cysticercus Tarandi or muscle cysticercosis, to the point where it is generally not usable for human consumption as determined

by the person inspecting the moose, then, upon application, the commissioner shall issue a replacement permit allowing the permittee to take an additional

1	moose. Any moose carcus determined to be so infected	
2	shall become the property of the State.	
3	STATEMENT OF FACT	

This bill allows a moose permittee to procure a permit for an additional moose if the moose he presents for inspection is found to be infected to the point of being unusable for human consumption.

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
