11	Amend the bill in section 3, in subsection 3, by
12	inserting at the end (page 3, line 11 in L.D.) a new
13	sentence to read: 'For purposes of this subsection,
14	the term "insurance coverage" includes authorization
15	by the Superintendent of Insurance to self-insure.'
16	Further amend the bill in section 5, in subsec-
17	tion 2, by striking out the last paragraph (page 4,
18	lines 22 to 24 in L.D.) and inserting in its place
19	the following:
20	'If that employer is a corporation, any agent of the
21	corporation having primary responsibility for obtain-
22	ing insurance coverage is liable for punishment under
23	this section. Determination of criminal liability
24	shall be in conformity with Title 17-A, sections 60
25	and 61.'
26 27 28	Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 6 (page 4, lines 25 to 33 in L.D.) and in- serting in its place the following:
29 30	' Sec. 6. 39 MRSA \$104-A, sub-\$3 is enacted to read:
31	3. Certificate. Notwithstanding any other pro-
32	vision of law or rule of evidence, the certificate of
33	the Director of Administrative Services, under seal
34	of the commission, shall be received in any court in
35	this State as prima facie evidence of facts pertain-
36	ing to insurance coverage records contained in the
37	certificate or within the documents attached to the

2 STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment is intended to clarify or correct 3 the original bill in 3 ways. First, it clarifies that the requirement to obtain workers' compensation 4 5 6 insurance coverage is satisfied if an employer qualifies to self-insure. Second, it clarifies the 1 a-7 bility of corporate agents where an employer is a corporation and fails to obtain workers' compensation 8 9 insurance coverage for its employees. 10 Finally, it 11 limits the nature of facts which may be certified under the bill by the Workers' Compensation Commission 12 to facts related to insurance coverage records. 13
