AN ACT to Establish an Alternative to the Certificate of Need Process to Address the Needs of Medicaid Patients in Need of Nursing Home Care.

9§326. Alternative mechanisms for addressing the10needs of Medicaid patients in need of nursing11home care

 Findings. The Legislature makes the following findings.

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The Medicaid program has a fundamental obli-Α. 1 2 gation to meet the needs of eligible individuals 3 in need of nursing home care. There is an acute and growing shortage of 4 Б. 5 nursing home beds with respect to both Medicaid 6 eligible and other individuals. C. The provision of additional beds by itself 7 8 will not satisfy the needs of all individuals. D. In addition, the Medicaid program has an ob-9 ligation to provide reasonable payments to meet 10 the needs of eligible individuals. 11 E. Determination of the appropriate mechanism to 12 13 meet these needs will require further analysis 14 and experimentation. 2. Purpose. The purpose of this section is to require the department, in consultation with repre-15 16 sentative groups, to determine the current need for 17 18 beds for Medicaid eligible persons in need of nursing home care, to assess the capacity of the current sys-19 20 tem to fulfill these needs and to develop alternative 21 mechanisms to address these needs. Report and proposed legislation required. The 22 department shall, on or before December 1, 1987, 23 re-24 port to the joint standing committee of the Legisla-25 ture having jurisdiction over human resources, pro-26 posed legislation to establish an alternative process 27 to respond to the findings and purpose of this sec-28 tion. The department shall consult with representative groups including, but not limited to, the Maine Health Care Association and the Maine Committee on Aging. The department shall give due consideration to 29 30 31 32 a variety of proposals, including, but not limited 33 to: 34 A. A request for proposal and bidding process 35 similar to that utilized by the Office of the 36. State Bureau of Purchases and other state agen-37 cies; 38 B. A contract process with existing nursing 39 homes for provision of Medicaid beds on a negoti-40 ated basis; and

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C. A voucher process where Medicaid recipients and their families would be permitted to negotiate individual contractual arrangements.
