STATEMENT OF FACT

Of the 140,118 people aged 65 and over in the State approximately 25% or 35,230 have significant, acute mental health needs. Severe depression is a common reaction to failing health and other involuntary life changes. Chronic mental problems are more difficult to manage in old age. In addition, many families struggle to help elderly relatives to cope with the yet unexplained dementias that affect some elderly persons. The provision of elderly mental health services specialists is supported by recommendations of the Joint Advisory Committee to Maine's Bureau of Elderly Services and the Bureau of Mental Health and the Federal Task Force on Alzheimers Disease and Related Disorders.
