1 2	AN ACT Concerning Delinquent Dog Licenses.
3 4	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
5 6	7 MRSA $\S3702$, as amended by PL 1979, c. 492, $\S11$, is further amended to read:
7	§3702. Warrants; disposal
8 9 10 11 12 13 14	The municipal officers of each municipality shall annually between January 1st and April 30th issue a warrant, returnable on October 15th following, to one or more police officers, constables, sheriff or animal control officer, directing him or them to proceed forthwith immediately to enter complaint and summons to court the owner or keeper of any unlicensed dog.
L5	The police officer, constable, sheriff or animal con-

1	trol officer shall, before entering such complaint
2	and obtaining the summons, call on the owner or keep-
3	er of the dog, or send notice of the violation of law
4	by certified mail to the owner's or keeper's last
5	known address, and demand that he conform with the
6	law and obtain a license from the clerk within 7 days
7	from the day of demand, paying to the clerk in addi-
	tion to the license fee, an officer's fee of \$4,
9	which the clerk shall pay over to the officer, unless
10	the payment is otherwise provided for in the munici-
11	pal ordinance or charter.

12 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill allows a municipal official enforcing the dog licensing law to notify a person by certified mail of a violation rather than requiring that the official personally call on the owner or keeper of the dog.
