1 AN ACT to Amend the Definition of Eligibility
2 under the Elderly Low-cost Drug Program.

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
5 follows:

6 36 MRSA §6162, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 726, §7,
7 is amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to
8 read:

9 Notwithstanding section 6108, if the income of
10 each member of a household of 2 or more members does
11 not exceed the individual income limitation set out
12 in section 6108, as annually adjusted, members of
13 that household are eligible for the Elderly Low-cost
14 Drug Program described in Title 22, section 254.

The purpose of this bill is to allow households of 2 or more persons to qualify for the Elderly Low-cost Drug Program, even if their combined incomes exceed the statutory limitations, if each member's income does not exceed the limitation established for individuals.
