0 1 2 3	Every facility licensed under this chapter shall include in its bylaws and policies provisions setting forth staff and practice privileges which are available to licensed psychologists.

2		This bill requires each hospital and nursing home
3		in this State to develop a policy regarding the staff
4	i ka	and practice privileges which it makes available to
5		licensed psychologists and include that policy in its
6		official documents. Such privileges vary throughout
· 7 ₁		the State and some hospitals appear to have no poli-
8		cy. This bill makes no requirement as to what the
9	j.,	policy must be, leaving that to the individual facil-
10		ity.

11. Knowing what these privileges are is important to 12 psychologists treating persons who may be hospital13 ized. In addition, mental health treatment is proven 14 effective in reducing health care costs and the 15 availability of such services can be beneficial to 16 both the patient and the institution.
