AN ACT Making Changes to the Dietitian

<b>4</b> 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

8 9 10 11 12 13 14	In order to recognize the professional qualifications of dietitians and dietetic technicians and to assure the availability to the public of information regarding those who hold themselves out to be dietitians and dietetic technicians, it is the purpose of this chapter to provide for the registration licensing of qualified dietitians and dietetic technicians.

- 5. Licensed dietetic technician. "Registered Licensed dietetic technician" means a person registered licensed under this chapter who practices dietetics under the supervision of a dietitian who is registered licensed in accordance with this chapter.

- 17 §9903. Board of Licensing of Dietetic Practice; es-18 tablishment; compensation
- 19 Establishment and membership. There is tablished, within the Department of Business, Occupa-20 21 tional and Professional and Financial Regulation, the Board of Registration Licensing of Dietetic Practice. 22 23 The board shall consist of 5 members appointed by the Governor, including 2 public members who are residents of this State, who do not hold registration a 24 25 license to practice dietetics and who have no direct 26 27 or indirect financial interest in the practice or de-28 livery of dietetic services. Other than these public 29 members, the persons appointed to the board 30 have been engaged in rendering dietetic services to the public or in teaching or research in dietetics for at least 2 years immediately preceding their ap-31 32 33 pointments. Two board members shall be dietitians. The 5th member shall be either a dietitian or a 34 35 dietetic technician. The professional members shall 36 all times be holders of valid registrations 37 licenses under this chapter, except for the members

of the first board, each of whom shall fulfill the

requirements for registration licensing under this

chapter.

2. Terms of appointment. To the first board established under this chapter, the Governor shall appoint 2 board members for terms of one year, 2 for terms of 2 years and one for a term of 3 years. Appointments made thereafter shall be for 3-year terms, but no person may be appointed to serve more than 3 consecutive terms, provided that for this purpose only, a period actually served which exceeds 1/2 of a 3-year term shall be deemed a full term. Any member of the board may be removed from office for cause by the Governor.

- 3. Meetings. The board shall meet at least once a year to conduct its business and to elect a chairperson. Additional meetings shall be held as necessary to conduct the business of the board and may be covened at the call of the chairperson or a majority of the board members. A majority of the members of the board shall constitute a quorum for all purposes.
  - 4. <u>Compensation.</u> Members of the board shall be compensated as provided in Title 5, section 12002-A.
  - §9904. Board of Licensing of Dietetic Practice; powers and duties
  - 1. <u>Powers.</u> The board shall administer and enforce this chapter and evaluate the qualifications of applicants for registration <u>licensing</u>. The board may examine witnesses, administer oaths and shall investigate or cause to be investigated any complaints made to it or any cases of noncompliance with or violation of this chapter.
- 2. Rules. The board may adopt, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, rules relating to professional conduct to carry out the policy of this chapter, including, but not limited to, rules relating to professional registration licensing and to the establishment of ethical standards of practice for persons registered licensed to practice dietetics in this State.
  - 3. <u>Hearings</u>. Hearings may be conducted by the board to assist with investigations, to determine whether grounds exist for suspension, revocation or denial of a registration license or as otherwise

- deemed necessary to the fulfillment of its responsibilities under this chapter. Hearings shall be conducted in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter IV, to the extent applicable.
  - 4. Records. The board shall keep such records and minutes as are necessary to the ordinary dispatch of its functions.
- 9 5. <u>Contracts.</u> The board may enter into con-10 tracts to carry out its responsibilities under this 11 chapter.
- 12 6. Reports. No later than August 1st of each
  13 year, the board shall submit to the commissioner, for
  14 the preceding fiscal year, its annual report of its
  15 operations together with such comments and recommen16 dations as the commissioner deems essential.

- 21 l. <u>Employees.</u> With the advice of the board, the commissioner may appoint, subject to the Civil Service Law, such employees as may be necessary to carry out this chapter. Any person so employed shall be located in the department and under the administrative and supervisory direction of the commissioner.
- 27 2. <u>Budget.</u> The board shall submit to the commissioner its budgetary requirements in the same manner as provided in Title 5, section 1665.

1. Licensing required. No person may practice
dietetics or hold himself out to be a registered
licensed dietitian or a registered licensed dietetic
technician or use related terms or words, unless he
is registered licensed in accordance with this chapter.

1 2. <u>Individual licensing.</u> Only an individual may 2 be registered licensed under this chapter.

3. <u>Penalty; injunction.</u> A person who violates this section is guilty of a Class E crime.

The State may bring an action in Superior Court to enjoin any person from violating this chapter, regardless of whether proceedings have been or may be instituted in the Administrative Court or whether criminal proceedings have been or may be instituted.

### 10 §9907. Requirements for licensing; education; expe-11 rience

- 1. <u>Dietitian's licensing</u>. An applicant for registration <u>licensing</u> as a dietitian shall file a written application on forms provided by the board, showing to the satisfaction of the board that he meets the following requirements.
- A. The applicant must exhibit adherence to established ethical professional standards.
  - B. An applicant shall present evidence satisfactory to the board of having successfully completed the academic requirements established by the American Dietetic Association or equivalent requirements as determined by the board and shall have received a baccalaureate or higher degree from an accredited college or university. Such a includes in organic program courses inorganic chemistry, human physiology, microbiology, principles of sociology or psychology, basic communication skills, economics, food composition, nutrition and management theory.
  - C. An applicant shall submit to the board evidence of having successfully completed the experience requirements approved by the American Dietetic Association or equivalent experience approved by the board. That experience shall include at least 6 months full-time clinical experience in the field of dietetics, or its part-time equivalent. The experience shall have been

acquired during or within 5 years of completion

- of the academic requirements in paragraph B and not more than 5 years before the date of license application.
  - D. The applicant must have successfully completed an examination given by the American Dietetic Association or its equivalent as determined and administered by the board.
  - 2. <u>Dietetic technician's licensing</u>. An applicant for registration <u>licensing</u> as a dietetic technician shall file a written application on forms provided by the board showing to the satisfaction of the board that he meets the following requirements.
- 13 A. The applicant must exhibit adherence to es-14 tablished ethical professional standards.
- B. The applicant must have graduated from a dietetic technician program approved by the Commission on Accreditation of the American Dietetic Association or its equivalent, as determined by the board, or graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Food and Nutrition from an approved 4-year program.

### §9908. Issuance of license

The board shall issue a registration <u>license</u> to any person who meets the requirements of this chapter upon payment of the prescribed fee.

### §9909. Term of license

- 1. Annual renewal. Registration A license shall expire annually on December 31st or on such other date as the commissioner may determine. Notice of expiration shall be mailed to each registrant's licensee's last known address at least 30 days in advance of the expiration of his registration the license. The notice shall include any requests for information necessary for renewal.
- Registrations <u>Licenses</u> may be renewed up to 90 days after the date of expiration upon payment of a late fee of \$10 in addition to the renewal fee. Any person who submits an application for renewal more than

- 1 90 days after the registration <u>licensing</u> renewal date 2 shall be subject to all requirements governing new 3 applicants under this chapter.
- 4 2. Continuing education. Each registration bicense renewal shall be accompanied by evidence of continuing education or other requirements as established in rule by the board.

- 2. Disciplinary actions; grounds. The board may suspend or revoke a registration license pursuant to Title 5, section 1004. In addition, the board may refuse to renew or the Administrative Court may revoke, suspend or refuse to renew any registration license issued under this chapter on any of the following grounds:
- A. The practice of fraud or deceit in obtaining a registration <u>license</u> under this chapter or in connection with service rendered within the scope of the registration <u>license</u> issued;
- B. A registrant <u>licensee</u> shall be deemed to have engaged in unprofessional conduct if he violates any standard of professional behavior which has been established in the practice of dietetics;
- C. Subject to the limitations of Title 5, chapter 341, conviction of a crime which involves dishonesty or false statement or which relates directly to the practice for which the individual is registered licensed or convicted of any crime for which imprisonment for one year or more may be imposed; or
  - D. Any violation of this chapter or rules adopted by the board.
  - 3. Reinstatement. An application for reinstatement may be made to the board after one year from the date of revocation of a registration license.

The board shall adopt rules establishing requirements for a temporary license within the scope of this chapter.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill makes several changes in the State's law setting forth credentials for professiona dietitians. These changes which have been discusse with both the licensing board and the America Dietitians Association are as follows:
7 l. Changing the credential from registration t 8 license, more accurately reflecting the nature o 9 dietitians work and educational requirements;
2. Including a requirement for an examination to be passed in order to become a licensed dietitian;
3. Adding a provision for the Board of Dietetic Registration to grant temporary licenses under certain conditions;
4. Including the practice of dietetics as part of the scope of licensure; and
5. Authorizing the Board of Registration of Dietetic Practice to develop rules to carry out these changes.
