13	81031 Purpose	

- The purpose of this Article article is to use a public and private partnership to create a voluntary potato quality control system, operated through the Maine Potato Board and the department, to promote the sale of Maine potatoes.
- 6 Sec. 3. 7 MRSA §1032, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 7 698, §§14 and 15, is amended to read:

§1032. Definitions

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- As used in this Article article, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
- 12 1. <u>Board</u>. "Board" means the Maine Potato Quality
 13 Centrel Board established pursuant to section 1933
 14 Title 36, chapter 710.
- 2. <u>Consumer pack</u>. "Consumer pack" means a unit of 50 pounds or less net weight of potatoes contained in a bag or other type of container. Consumer pack shall not mean a master container.
- 2-A- Identification marks of bag manufacturers and bag distributors. Identification marks of bag manufacturers and bag distributors are exempt from this Article.
- 3. <u>Maine bag.</u> "Maine bag" means any consumer pack for potatoes on which appears the word Maine in letters larger than 1/4 inch or a pictorial representation of the outline of the shape of the state State.
- 4. <u>Maine bag grade.</u> "Maine bag grade" means any of the officially established grades of potatoes as adopted by the beard commissioner.
- 31 5- Other than Maine bag. A bag other than a 32 Maine bag may have the word "Maine" appear only in
- the name and address of the producer, packer or any other person, at the bottom of the bag, provided that the letters are not taller than 1/4 inch.

_	gross. Duties of the Board, finances
2 3 4	1. Board. The Maine Potato Quality Control Board established by Title 5, section 12004, subsection 9, shall consist of the following members:
5 6	A. One representative elected by the Maine Potate Commission;
7 8 9 10 11	B. Five representatives elected by the Maine Potato Council, one from each of the 3 districts defined in section 993, subsection 3, paragraphs A, C and D, and 2 from the district defined in section 993, subsection 3, paragraph B,
12 13	6. One representative elected by the Maine Potate Sales Association;
14 15	D. A representative of the department, appointed by the commissioner; and
16 17	E- A person appointed by the Governor to represent consumers-
18 19 20	Members shall serve for staggered 2-year terms. In the initial membership, the board shall determine that 4 of its members shall serve for one-year terms.

33 34	E. To require reports of inspectors on work done under this Article;

F. To adopt a fee schedule and require the payment of a fee to cover such portion of the expenses of the board as the board determines necessary;

- G. To recommend to the commissioner the maximum inspection fee which should be assessed for loads packed in Maine bags and to advise the commissioner of all factors necessary to achieve full industry participation in the Maine Bag Program; and
- H. To do other acts necessary to implement this Article article.
- 3. Finances. The board may receive funds from any source for the purpose of implementing this article and shall spend those funds in furtherance of this Article for that purpose. The members shall be compensated as provided in Fitle 57 chapter 379. The board may employ staff and hire consultants. Any funds received by the board shall be placed in a nonlapsing revolving fund.
- 4. Standards. The board shall conduct its business consistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act. Title 5, chapter 375, and the Freedom of Access laws, Title 1, chapter 13, subchapter 1, but shall not be considered a state agency.

§1033-A. Duties of the commissioner

- 1. <u>Inspection fee.</u> After considering the recommendations of the board, as provided in section 1033, subsection 2, paragraph 6, subsection 1, paragraph F, and after considering available money appropriated from the General Fund, the commissioner shall set the inspection fee for loads packed in Maine bags pursuant to rules adopted pursuant to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375.
- 37 2. <u>Statement of basis for fee.</u> Upon request of the board, the commissioner shall provide to the board and other interested parties a written state-

- 1 ment of the basis for the fee established under this section.
- 3 3. Maine bag grades. After consultation with 4 the board and pursuant to the rule-making provisions 5 of Title 5, chapter 375, the commissioner shall adopt the official grade or grades for potatoes to be 6 7 packed in Maine bags. These rules become effective on August 1st following the effective date of this 8 9 subsection and may be amended only annually after that date, with amendments becoming effective on Au-10 11 gust 1st of the year in which adopted. No Maine bag 12 grade may be less than United States No. 1.

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- The board shall adopt an official logo which, at a minimum, shall contain an outline of the shape of the State.

- 1. <u>Packing and inspection</u>. No person may pack potatoes in a Maine bag, unless he has given notice of intent to pack to the beard department, in such form as the department may require.
- 28 2. Shipping. A packer shall ship in a Maine bag 29 only those potatoes that have been determined by a 30 duly authorized inspector to have met the standards 31 required by this Artiele article.
 - 2-A. Other than Maine bag. No person may pack potatoes in any consumer pack other than a Maine bag on which the word "Maine" appears, except that the word "Maine" may appear on such a consumer pack if it is in the name and address of producer, packer or any other person, at the bottom of the bag and in letters not taller than 1/4 inch.

It is the intent of the Legislature that the Part I Budget reflect the elimination of the Maine Potato Quality Control Board and that the funds formerly appropriated to the board be appropriated to the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, to be granted to the Maine Potato Board for the promotion of tablestock potatoes.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The 112th Legislature enacted legislation which 3 consolidated the previously highly fragmented organi-4 οf the Maine Potato Industry into 5 single-industry organization, the Maine Potato Board. 6 In the legislative findings for the legislation which 7 created the Maine Potato Board, the 112th Legislature stated that its purpose was to "create a unified or-8 9 ganizational structure to provide for the advancement the Maine Potato Industry" in which "all elements 10 of the Maine Potato Industry will be represented 11 12 will work together under the leadership of a unified, 13 public board to solve the problems facing the industry." The authority to adopt grades for potatoes to be packed in Maine bags is transferred from the Quality Control Board to the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, who must establish those grades through rulemaking, following consultation with the Maine Potato Board.
