10 11	The Secretary of State on application and upon evidence of payment of the excise tax required by Ti-
12	tle 36, section 1482, shall issue a registration cer-

tificate and a set of special designating plates to

be used in lieu of regular registration plates to any person who is hearing impaired when that application

Т	is accompanied by a form, available from the Division
2	of Deafness, Bureau of Rehabilitation, certified by a
3	physician stating that the applicant is hearing im-
4	paired and cannot hear or understand normal speech.

5	These special designating plates shall bear the
6	letters "H I," positioned vertically, with the "H"
7	first, preceded on the left by a 4-digit number.
8	Any person who qualifies for such a license shall
9	also be eligible to receive a special transferable

Any person who qualifies for such a license shall also be eligible to receive a special transferable shield which can be displayed in the front windshield on the driver's side when that person is operating the vehicle.

The special license plates and tags are designed to help law enforcement officials recognize deaf and hearing impaired drivers. The tags and decals will alert the officials that the driver will require special communication techniques in order to eliminate misunderstandings. The hearing impaired tag-decal concept was conceived as a safety measure.
