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Transfers \$1,200,000 2 from the Rainy Day 3 Fund Program to the 4 Bureau of Public Im-5 provements - Plan-6 ning and Construc-7 tion Administration 8 to provide suffi-9 cient funds for the 10 design and recon-11 struction of the en-12 trance to the Maine 13 State Cultural 14 Building and for re-15 lated improvements. 16 It is intended that 17 these funds shall 18 not lapse, but shall 19 remain available for 20 the same purpose.

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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

### 24 STATEMENT OF FACT

Since its initial construction, the entrance to the Maine State Cultural Building has leaked, causing significant water damage to the Maine State Library's sections of the building. In the past year, leaks around the entrance as well as through the main roof have caused still further damage.

Public Law 1985, chapter 814, effective June 5, 1986, provided a total of \$1,400,000 to repair the roof of the Maine State Cultural Building and carry out asbestos abatement and reconstruction. This money, together with other general repair funds, is sufficient only to complete the asbestos abatement and reconstruction, resealing and waterproofing the exterior of the building and reroofing the building.

Additional money is needed to reconstruct the entrance to the building, covering the court area to avoid continued damage from a faulty design. Estimated costs are \$1,200,000.

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5 emergency appropriation from the Rainy Day 6 Fund Program is needed to provide immediate funding 7 allowing proper bidding and contracting procedures to 8 be carried out so that construction can begin this summer and be coordinated with the roof replacement 9 10 and masonry repair. The regular appropriation process would delay construction until the spring of 11 12 and the building would suffer further damage 13 during this period.

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
