1                      AN ACT to Make Allocations from the  
2                      Transportation Safety Fund for the  
3                      Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1988, and

6                      Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-  
7                      lature do not become effective until 90 days after  
8                      adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

9                      Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate un-  
10                      til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

11                      Whereas, certain obligations and expenses inci-  
12                      dent to the operation of the department will become  
13                      due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1987;  
14                      and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §2713, sub-§3, ¶A, as amended by PL 1985, c. 350, §1, is further amended to read:

A. There shall be allocated to the Department of Public Safety for State Police up to ~~\$1,100,000~~ \$1,200,000 annually from the fund to carry out the statutory duties of the bureau imposed by this chapter and Title 35 and for related activities.

Sec. 2. Allocation of Transportation Safety Fund. Income to the Transportation Safety Fund for the next 2 fiscal years, from July 1, 1987, to June 30, 1988, and from July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in the following schedule:

2 Sec. 3. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations  
3 may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Of-  
4 ficer, with the approval of the Governor, to specifi-  
5 cally cover those adjustments determined to be neces-  
6 sary under any salary plan approved by the Legisla-  
7 ture, and those reclassifications or range changes  
8 which have been approved by the Department of Admin-  
9 istration and submitted for legislative review prior  
10 to the effective date of this Act.

11 Sec. 4. Encumbered balance at year end. At the  
12 end of each fiscal year, all encumbered balances  
13 shall not be carried more than once.

14 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited  
15 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect on July  
16 1, 1987.
